- B. Superintendent Update
- March – Board of Education Month
On behalf of the school district, Melinda Smith thanked the members of the Board of Education on their continued hard work and support of the Thompson Public Schools.
 - Enrollment Update – The March enrollment is at 1,009 students, up four students from February.
- C. Accountability Report – Ian Polun presented to the Board an update on the Accountability Report.
- D. Social/Emotional Student Supports - Melinda Smith stated that the social and emotional part of learning is very important in the district. Shawn Brissette asked what is going on in the community, and especially the school, to address social-emotional learning. Mr. Scott Sugarman gave the Board a handout on the steps toward addressing this issue which includes adding a Social Worker into the district, adding Tools of the Mind-Self-Regulation through Purposeful Play and increase staff training.
- E. BOE Sub-Committees – No discussion.
- F. Calendar Update – Ms. Smith noted that the State regulation for the number of school days is 180 per school year. The current TPS school calendar allows for 181 student days. She would like the Board to approve the 181st day as a make-up snow day. This is up for approval under action items.
- G. Administrator Report

- From last year to this year, ELA growth targets went up ten points, and Math growth targets for high needs student went up five points.
 - Medicaid and tuition reimbursement numbers are continuing to increase.
 - Out-of-district numbers has decreased from 17 students to 14 this school year.
- Ms. Noveline Beltram
- International Paper Grant- Improve Classroom Libraries through Reading Engagement Project. The first objective of this project is to provide grades 3 & 4 classrooms with books that will foster student engagement. The second objective is to increase student attendance by motivating students to attend school by offering books that would appeal across gender, race, ethnicity, and income while supporting the reading curriculum.
 - Mystic Aquarium Grant- Field Coast Study. One grade to attend Mystic Aquarium- all buses and fees are paid through the grant.
 - MRFES as partner to Thompson Recreation and The American Heart Association, Physical Education teacher Jon Fontaine raised over \$5000 with the Jump Rope for Heart event- \$300 will be given to him to purchase equipment.

- Anthony Vajcovec, grade 8 student, has qualified to compete in the State level competition of the National Geographic Bee on Friday, April 6, 2018.
 - The elementary/middle school variety show took place on February 16, 2018. Students from both schools showcased their talent which included comedy, dancing, and singing. Thank you to Mr. Leclerc and Ms. Rossetti for coordinating a fantastic evening of student talent.
 - Opportunity for our afterschool boatbuilding students to sail aboard the Schooner Brilliant in June. This opportunity is being made possible through a grant from Mystic Seaport.
